Auburn Youth Resources (AYR) is a private, non-profit child and family resource agency serving South King & North Pierce Counties since 1973. AYR operates three major community-based programs providing individual & family counseling, two residential facilities for homeless & displaced children, mobile outreach services for homeless young people, adolescent substance abuse prevention, intervention, chemical dependency treatment and dual diagnosis treatment services. In addition, we provide Student Assistance Programs in 32 schools within 5 school districts.

Services are provided regardless of national origin, religion, gender, sexual preference, AIDS diagnosis, HIV status, or disability. AYR partners with local schools to best serve our youth.

The TIPS Program provides a continuum of programs ranging from prevention to aftercare. The overall goal of the program is to prevent and reduce youth substance abuse and violence in our communities.

TIPS has been a Washington State Licensed substance abuse treatment provider since 1983. Our prevention and treatment programs rely upon evidence based best practice models of prevention, intervention and treatment.

TIPS provides these services in King & Pierce Counties, in schools and in our seven agency locations in Enumclaw and Auburn.

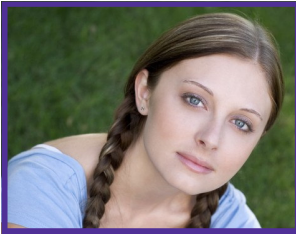

Outpatient Groups

DASA Certified outpatient drug and alcohol treatment programs provided at agency sites and in schools

Family Based Services

Family based treatment services that values and includes the family as part of the youth's recovery.



Individual Services

Individual sessions that empower youth to define a treatment plan and case management services to develop the means and intent to realize the vision.

School and Court Ordered Services

Diversion and Probation Court ordered substance abuse evaluations and treatment.

Relapse Prevention Groups

Relapse Prevention Groups provided that serve to reinforce skills and support recovery. These services are offered in agency sites and schools.

Dual Diagnosis Services

AYR provides specialized dual diagnosis services for youth experiencing both mental health and substance abuse problems.

Substance Abuse Assessments

AYR utilizes the nationally recognized Global Appraisal of Individual Needs (GAIN) substance abuse assessment and the ASAM patient placement criteria to provide accurate, comprehensive and reliable client assessment. These evidence based services are provided at our agency sites, schools and probation offices.

Student Assistance Program

School-based Student Assistance Prevention-Intervention Services Program providing: screenings, full assessments, at-risk social skills groups, classroom and community prevention, intervention groups, affected other's groups, and recovery support groups.



AOD Life-Skills Groups

Alcohol & Other Drugs Life Skills educational groups are offered to students with the goal of building drug resistance skills.

School ordered, court ordered, & private drug screens available by appointment.
